We celebrate enrollment at a 20 year high as we settle into the 2024-25 school year, with over 250 students representing 156 families and 40 different congregations! We are thrilled to welcome more than 20 new families to the BMS community. but we are also facing a major budget shortfall.

The cost of educating students in a different and deeper way continues to increase rapidly. However, the income from our major annual fundraisers has not grown at the same rate as our expenses. In fact, it has declined in recent years.

We are actively pursuing a variety of initiatives to expand what we offer students, our reach throughout the community, and new ways to support the cost of providing an education grounded in truth.


